



## **Food Justice Intern Summer 2024**

Indiana Justice Project seeks an individual for a part-time summer internship position. This position will support IJP's Food Justice Fellow, helping address food insecurity, health equity and economic justice through advocacy in the SNAP program.

### **Details**

- Eight-to-twelve-week position, starting Mid-May, with the possibility of extension through the fall.
- Expectation of 10 to 15 hours a week.
- Compensation: \$15/hour.
- Location and hours: hybrid with weekly travel to in-person meetings in Indianapolis.

### **Duties and Responsibilities**

The Food Justice intern will work with IJP staff and partners on some or all of the following:

- Develop digital and social media assets.
- Assist with SNAP research, memo, and brief drafting.
- Deliver Know Your Rights presentations to community partners.
- Create asset maps to identify existing community resources.
- Help plan for a SNAP Language Access Plan Stakeholder Feedback forum or SNAP and Limited English Proficiency individuals listening sessions.

### **Qualifications**

Applicants must be enrolled at least part-time in an accredited college or university in a relevant undergrad or graduate degree program. Candidates from any concentration are welcome to apply. The ideal candidate has:

- A passion for food security, health equity, economic justice, and community involvement.
- Strong communication skills, both written and verbal.
- Excellent interpersonal skills.
- Excellent organizational and problem-solving skills.
